The programme is co-ordinated by Mrs Lucie Harris, our Head of Learning Support, Mrs Pagni, our Learning Support Assistant, and our expert team of specialist Boost Tutors, each with their own area of expertise.

No matter how talented or able the student, there may come a time in a student's school life when she needs some additional support in her academic work. Our Boost Programme offers bespoke and tailored solutions to make sure that students have access to positive, encouraging and effective support and guidance.

Mrs Clare Richards

Specialism: English

I'm really happy to be able to join the Boost Team this year, having spent around 14 years teaching English at King's High across the Key Stages, but more recently particularly with GCSE students. Understanding what is required in examination assessment criteria and coursework assessment criteria is particularly useful when working with students who find, at various points in their learning, that they may need a period of more targeted assistance to rediscover their confidence or improve their understanding.

I enjoy supporting individuals who find they need to revise key aspects of analysis or reading and writing skills on a one-to-one basis; this is often an effective space in which to practice or get to grips with areas students may feel they lack confidence tackling in the classroom or larger groups, particularly in the step up to GCSE level working from Key Stage 3. It is really inspiring to see students benefit from an increase in understanding and confidence in applying these skills more effectively in their wider schoolwork, after tailoring learning more specifically to individual requirements. Sometimes you just need a bit of time and space to be able to really get to understand something and I enjoy being able to support students' learning in this way.



Mr David Brett

Specialism: Mathematics

After gaining a Mathematics degree from the University of Warwick I trained as an auditor and qualified as a chartered accountant. I lectured accountancy students for ten years and then spent the rest of my career as an accountant in finance. Since 'retirement' I have spent four years as a teaching assistant with a focus on SEN pupils.

I have really struggled with academic studies at certain times in my life and know what it feels like when a general dislike of a subject develops and frustration and concern build up. My approach to supporting and tutoring students starts with the objective of raising their confidence level and, ideally, making the learning experience enjoyable. Once achieved, improvements in ability invariably follows. Developing an excellent rapport with any pupil I work with is crucial and humour is an important element of this. Whether I am supporting pupils who are struggling with aspects of the mathematics syllabus or pupils who are looking for marginal gains to increase their grades I enjoy working with them to establish the most effective way of improving their performance. I am delighted to be joining the Boost Team at King's High.

Boost Programme – Overview

The Boost team is focused on the individual needs of each pupil. We work to understand the specific academic and learning needs of the student before developing an action plan with targeted support strategies. We will communicate with parents throughout this process. The wider academic support available at King's includes:

- Departmental workshops and study clinics
- Sixth Form academic mentoring programme
- Occasional talks for parents and students about study skills and specific learning needs
- Personalised learning using digital technology to support progress
- Peer mentors
- Staff coaches

The various additional support and provision offered by the Boost Programme can include:

- Daily Boost lunchtime sessions with our expert Boost team
- Boost's KS3 small group intensive courses on core skills
- One-to-one tutorials; sessions on core skills and core subjects
- Regular communication with teaching staff and parents to ensure that teaching is responsive to individual learning needs
- Bespoke sessions to develop confidence and self-esteem, as well as memory skills, study skills, and revision strategies
- Assembly input around study and revision skills

Get Your Daily Boost!

We love all students to be able to access learning support on a daily basis at King's. Based in the 'Oasis' space students have free access to meet with a member of the Learning Support department. An opportunity like this encapsulates our 'open door' commitment to support all students. It is an opportunity to come and work on projects, coursework, homework, to research or talk through any academic concerns with our Head of Learning Support in our designated Learning Support Space – The 'Oasis'.

Boost's Key Stage 3 Support

Sometimes when it is felt that a student would benefit from additional lessons on core skills (English, Maths, note taking, organisation and revision), it is possible for a student to come off a lesson in Key Stage 3. Instead of attending this lesson, students would attend the Oasis space for tailored support in response to the specific needs of the student. This is led by Mrs Harris, or one of her expert team.

This is an excellent way to build confidence and tailor the curriculum to the individual needs of the student, who may benefit more from additional time on English, Maths and other core skills. These sessions are free of charge.

Boost's Key Stage 4 Support

For students who have a modified curriculum at KS4, the Oasis space is our dedicated workspace. Students are encouraged to consolidate their learning here and keep a personal study log to track this. We offer general oversight in the space with dedicated teaching assistants encouraging and supporting students in busier sessions. Some students choose to have Boost bespoke tutoring in these sessions too.

Boost's Bespoke Tuition

It is also possible to arrange for bespoke one-to-one tuition with Mrs Harris or a member of her expert Boost team.

These 30 or 50 minute sessions will take place at a convenient time for the students attending. Each session will cost £28.55 for a 30 minute session; £47.70 for a 50 minute session.

The Boost team is focused on the individual needs of each student, so they will work to understand the specific learning needs before developing a tailored programme of learning with targeted support strategies. The following list outlines some of the courses that will run:

- Core Maths Skills
- Core English Skills
- Core Science Skills
- Core Study Skills (memory, revision and note taking strategies)
- Confidence and self-esteem
- English as an Additional Language
- French

Many students are enjoying tuition in their study periods weekly. This gives an opportunity for pre and post-teaching, reflection and consolidation.
