Join us on online on Wednesday 3rd March @ 4.30pm, to celebrate UN World Wildlife Day with Nikki Buxton, Director of Belize Bird Rescue, joining us live from Belize.

From Belize, a small country nestled between Mexico and Guatemala, Nikki will tell us about her journey from the UK to Belize, telling us about the fantastic work she does at Belize Bird Rescue.

Nikki Buxton is a founding member and managing director of the Belize Bird Rescue since its inception in 2004. Although the Centre works with every species of indigenous birds, her passion has always been parrots. Nikki is British with a BSc. Hons (Biology & Natural Sciences).

They protect, raise and release parrots which are under pressure from poaching. The endangered, endemic yellow-headed parrot is a high priority for the centre as their numbers are in steep decline.

Belize Bird Rescue is situated on a 50-acre private wildlife reserve bordered by 100 acres of dense forest providing a secure release site for the birds. The parrot facilities are extensive and growing every year. The centre (NGO) operates under license and support from the Government of Belize Forest Department.
